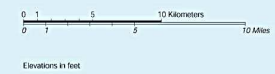


**Road closures**  
 Information on road closures outside Olympic National Park, can be found on the website of the Washington Department of Natural Resources or by the U.S. Forest Service.

**Most reefs, rocks, islets, and islands except the James Island group between 47°34' and 48°29' north latitude are national wildlife refuges.** They are off limits to visitors, and boats must remain 200 yards from the islands.

**Use caution when hiking the beaches.** Sudden high waves can pick up beach logs and turn them into weapons. They kill. Use the posted headland trails to avoid waves. Get the "Olympic Coastal Drive" folder at a ranger station before hiking on the coast.

**Coast hiking**  
 Wait for low tide or use overland trail if available.  
 Impossible headland always use overland trail

**All Roads Lead to Olympic**  
 Olympic National Park is easy to reach and the number of routes provide great variety with everchanging vistas. Ferries from Seattle take you across Puget Sound where any number of roads connect with U.S. 101, which encircles the park. All roads leading into the park connect with U.S. 101. Whether you are driving along the shores of the Hood Canal, or crossing through the landscape north of the park, or passing through the part of the park along the Pacific Ocean, you will come to get an impression of the Olympic Peninsula that will introduce you to the park itself.
